

In general the Christmas dinner in North Queensland today is a far different meal than the ones enjoyed in bygone years. For many years the mothers of our community slaved over hot stoves in even hotter summer weather to produce a hot, heavy and sometimes rather greasy meal. Not that we thought it was greasy then we liked our fat in those days. Now the typical Christmas dinner is more often than not a cold colation of seafoods and cold meats, with plenty of salads, fruit and cold sweets. No more slaving over a hot stove, and much more comfortable stomachs.

The home menu is not the only menu that has changed dramatically for Christmas dinner. Most catering establishments now offer cool, light menus for this annual feast. This is in stark contrast to the "olden times." This menu for the Hotel Fitzpatrick in Kuranda in 1934 shows how much the catering establishments have altered their fare to suit the present customers. ### Material Change of Use Kuranda Community Precinct

Council has endorsed the Material Change of Use application submitted by the Kuranda Community Precinct Advisory Committee (KCPAC) in relation to the development of the Kuranda Community Precinct.

Council has also endorsed the engagement of Clarke & Prince and sub-consultants along with the concept plans for the relocation of the Kuranda Library and initial car park, as endorsed by the KCPAC.

Deputy Mayor Cr Jenny Jensen said "The long term development of the Kuranda Community Precinct has been informed by extensive community consultation over many years and finally resulted in significant community support for the facility to be developed. The intention is that relocating the Kuranda Library to the Precinct will bring increased community participation in the Precinct,"


"The site is the former Kuranda Primary School which the former Mareeba Shire Council purchased and Council is supporting the long term development of the facility as a multipurpose community precinct," Cr Jensen said.

Mayor Tom Gilmore said "The Committee provides a formal means of community engagement and connection between Council and communities in the Kuranda district to facilitate community input for consideration by Council with respect to decisions about the development of this valuable community asset."

The Kuranda Community Precinct development will accommodate the relocated Kuranda Library as well as a number of indoor meeting/activity rooms and landscaped outdoor meeting/active play areas. The development will utilise a large portion of the former primary school infrastructure, with the remaining having previously been demolished and removed from site.

The proposed development is considered to be logical use of the already built up site; no significant issues have been identified with the development. Also included in the development is an upgrade of the car park, external lighting and minor landscaping, and renovation of the tiled wall as a community managed and funded project.

Earliest possible construction start for the car park is 15 December 2014, which is weather dependent. Advertising for tenders for building works will open on 5 January 2015 and close on 28 January 2015.

**ECEMBER** and with it the build-up to the Wet. Time to prepare for the Cyclone Season, taking stock of potential hazards in the garden, trees and branches over-hanging buildings and powerlines, dead palm fronds, garden furniture and children's play equipment, hanging baskets – all potentially serving as damaging missiles carried on gale force winds.

Early morning and after the heat of day passing, is the best time to water plants avoiding leaf burn and maximising moisture uptake. Mulching to conserve soil moisture and cool root conditions and weed suppression is a given. Investment in mulching now will also have benefits in the heavy and continued rains of the Wet, preventing run-offs and soil compaction.

Caladiums and Keampferias are now emerging from their winter's sleep, in all their various theatrical leaf forms and colourings and despite the repeated depredations of scrub turkey and golden-footed scrub fowl are rapidly filling gaps in plantings.

Plant of the Month: Kaempferia is a large genus of plants in the Zingiberaceae (Ginger) family, commonly referred to as the Peacock plants or Resurrection lily. Natives to China, India, and throughout South-east Asia, many of the near 100 species and hybrids provide excellent and adaptable understory plants, with striking leaf-patternings in tones of greens, pewter and silvery markings and carrying fleeting white through purplish flowers which often emerge before leaf-break. Quickly multiplying

from breaking up of rhizomes as warmer weather comes, and given their mostly low-growing forms, Kaempferias make excellent ground coverings in shady to dappled sun-lit places as well as potted and in-basket specimens. It must be remembered that Kaempferias go dormant as cold weather sets in, coming through again late October/mid-November so one has bare spots during their dormancy.

Easily propagated and cultivated, requiring only a well-mulched open soil and of average water requirements, the range and diversity of Kaempheria growth and leaf markings make these sometimes overlooked plants, treasures to be collected.

Now that warmer weather is here, plants are freely available or may be begged from a kindly neighbour, although some of the more sought-after forms are harder to find.

For the edible gardening fanatic, *Kaempferia galangal* with its plain green roundish leaves and white two purple spotted flower provides the rhizomes much used in Asian cooking and healing.






**P. Fruticosa.** The age of the potted specimen (30 years) and their remarkable hardiness make Polychias a seemingly forgotten standby of the tropical garden. Available from the low tuffet "Snowflake" through cane-like taller shrubs to tall trees, this family gives a wide choice in foliage shapes and colourations and is remarkable in adapting well to pot or garden culture and, once established, to considerable neglect. Plants, particularly finer leafed and dwarf specimens are sometimes sold as "Ming Trees". By the way, an aside question. Have you yet identified the striking clustered redbract, white flowered tree off-side, half way down the Range Road? I thought at first it may be the introduced Triplaris but closer inspection proved otherwise!




**Dear Unknown Questioner at Old Newsagency:** Sorry I have not yet completed research on your enquiry re: Red Sandal-wood. It would help if you clarify whether you are enquiring re seeds used as beads and referred to as red sandal wood beads or to the Himalayan forest giant Red Sandalwood famed for its use in Chinese furniture.

**Dear Ross:** The plant growing on your bank is *Callisia fragrans*, with its long glossy green leaves and is not a bromeliad although similar in its roseate plant form. This hardy plant will sucker along its rhizomes and in season will occasionally produce spikes of scented small white three petaled flowers. A fairly forgiving plant, it will grow more lushly in a more congenial situation and several variegate forms are available.

### The Senate enquiry into Government corruption has just finished taking public submissions

FoE Kuranda Secretary Stacey O'Brien submitted a 15 page submission to the Senate enquiry on corruption which focused on the coal seam gas approvals process at Mt Mulligan. The submission highlights an approval process that was rushed and which was signed with insufficient consultation and which put short term commercial gain above human and environmental considerations. The submission details the well known detrimental impacts CSG that extraction has on the natural, economical and social health of regions.

Due to the intrinsic nature of our total reliance on water for life and the evidence which shows a clear lack of assessment and corruption, the anti-CSG movement believes that the Queensland Government has acted irresponsibly and that there needs to be a moratorium immediately on all aspects of the coal seam gas industry until a proper commission of inquiry has taken place.

### The Community Cabinet Meeting will be held at 2pm Mareeba International Club, Vaughan Street on Sunday 30th November

This is a great opportunity to tell the Government what you think about fracking at Mt Mulligan and on Cape York. Even though gas companies promise some jobs and money for a few decades – once the gas extraction and fracking is finished they will just move on and leave the land, waterways and aquifers irredeemably contaminated and polluted for thousands of years over large areas. Be sure to make your voice heard. If anyone would like to help, support or donate to this important campaign against coal seam gas please get in touch. Mareeba Council needs to follow the lead of the Douglas Shire Council which has just declared their shire "Gas field free".





Eric Clapton & Friends: 'The Breeze' An appreciation of J.J. Cale



h, this is a must-have. The gently Arollicking grooves of J.J. Cale lovingly re-worked by Eric Clapton; Mark Knopfler, John Mayer, Tom Petty, Willy Nelson, Jon White and more. Mark Knopfler of course developed his guitar playing style straight from J.J. and Eric borrowed a lot from it also.

J.J. Cale, the shy, introspective country blues rock groover who wrote such classics as "Call Me The Breeze", "Cajun Moon", "Magnolia", "Lies" and the surprising cosmic "Starbound", all here.

Don White singing "Sensitive Kind" is, alone, worth buying this CD for. And John Mayer brings deliciously delicate guitar lines into "Lies", "Magnolia" and other tracks.

The photos of J.J. Cale from a kid to an old man are beautiful. One with Tom Petty is worth framing and Willy Nelson really earths "Songbird". "Cocaine" with its classic rock riff is a surprising omission. Maybe not P.C.? Never mind.



"Train to Nowhere" defines the final journey with an eerie inevitability. J.J.'s made the journey now and this is the perfect requiem. Naturally...

### Pink Floyd: 'The Endless River'

The final cut. No more. The survivors have called it quits. Dave Gilmour's unmistakable lead guitar and Rick Wright's hovering keyboard chords flow and evolve. All instrumental up to the final track "Louder than Words", it's not the resounding climax that we might

have hoped for. But Rick Wright's gone now, Roger Waters is out there still riding on the wall, Sid Barrett's long gone and only Dave Gilmour and drummer Nick Mason survive. A gently fade-out, but for those of us who have made the journey from the late 60's experimentation through 'The Dark Side', 'Over the Wall', through to 'The Division Bell' have so much to be grateful for. This album completes the trip and has much to enjoy. But mainly it sends you back to the "Meddle", the incredible "Animals" and, of course the overpowering "The Wall".

# The Healthy Kuranda-ite

### **Christmas Tree Sequence**

Tree pose (Vrksasana) is great for children of all ages. It improves balance and concentration. Vrksasana builds inner and outer strength. It is also lots of fun. If you wobble...don't worry! If

you fall...who cares? Plant yourself back up and start to grow again.

Just as real trees take time to grow, tree pose can also take time to learn. Be patient and gently find your balance. Imagine you have roots that extend from your foot into the ground and leaves on your fingers that may sway a little or a lot. Maybe you are a palm tree moving with the breeze. Maybe you are a really old tree, tall and strong.

There are so many tree pose options with only one rule. Never press your foot into your knee joint. Above or below the knee is perfect. The knee is a hinge joint and if pressure is applied from the side it can create stress and injury.

If this sequence is all too easy, challenge yourself by closing your eyes in each pose. Notice what is happening to your balance and focus when your eyes are closed.

### How To Grow Your (Christmas) Tree Pose


Baby Tree: Place the heel of your foot onto the ankle with toes touching the ground. Press your hands together in namaste position (anjali mudra). This is a great base pose to find your balance in.

Child Tree: Shift your weight into the foot that you are standing on. Lift your other foot onto your calf. Rest your foot to your calf keeping hands in anjali mudra. Keeping hands here helps with balance.

**Teen Tree:** Make a 4 with your legs by bringing your foot past your shin or thigh. Keep hands pressed together and slowly extend your arms above your head. Feel the difference in your balance as you raise your arms. You may need to focus harder to maintain balance.

Adult Tree: Place your leg in half lotus position with the side of your foot pressed into the top of the thigh. Keep hands above your head and grow your arms longer. If you have trouble keeping your leg in this position use your hand to support it and just raise one arm above your head. With practise you will be able to keep it there without support.

**Elder Tree:** Move your foot to press into the inner thigh of standing leg. Arms grow wide like branches and fingers stretch out like leaves. You now have a fully grown, strong and wise old tree. (Don't forget to practise the sequence standing on the other leg. Often we find one side is easier to balance on. See if you can notice which side is easiest for you.)



# Mareeba SHIRE COUNCIL

### **Material Change of Use Tourist Facility**

Council has endorsed the Material Change of Use application for a property on Speewah Road.

"The applicants propose the erection of 5 x 1-bedroom eco-style tourist cabins situated towards the rear of the site.

"The proposed cabins will be set amongst existing mature rainforest vegetation and will promote the site's tranquillity and natural landscape," Mayor Tom Gilmore said.

The site is situated at the very end of Speewah Road and the Dinden National Park adjoins the southern and eastern sides of the site, and each cabin will include a single bedroom, living area with kitchenette, bathroom and toilet facilities and an outdoor deck," Cr Gilmore said.

Mayor Tom Gilmore said "Each unit will be connected to a potable water supply, and individual septic system and will be provided with a single gravel sealed car parking space. It is understood the units will be serviced by gas and solar power supply.'

It is understood the tourist cabins will be available for occupation seven days a week and the venture will employ two persons.





We are reproducing a newer, yet at the same time obsolete version of everything, and it's costing us the Earth Why? Seriously, we must ask ourselves why. 

### **Cassowary Snacks In Production**

Weeping brown pine trees started producing cones along the cableway last month with the female cones first to get underway.

The female cones are fleshy and contain a single exposed green seed. The flesh is blue-green when unripe and turns dark red when it ripens.

Cassowaries seem to be very fond of these fleshy cones. The seed itself is loaded with nerve toxins.

The male cones are small yellow structures which release pollen into the air. Both sexes are represented on the same plant, but not at the same time.

These beautiful trees grow up to 30 metres and have distinctive crowns.

The leaves are long, thin straps which droop noticeably.

New growth is yellowish in colour. Weeping brown pine makes a fine potted plant for indoors.

This species also produces good timber with a variety of uses including boxes, butter churns, office fittings, kitchen fittings and internal house sheeting.

### **Traffic Tip – U Turns**

### **U-Turns only when permitted!**

U-turns can only be made at traffic lights when there is a U-TURN PERMITTED

If there is not a sign, DO NOT make a U-Turn.

Motorists caught doing a U-Turn at traffic lights when there is not a U-Turn Permitted sign can be issued a traffic infringement notice with a penalty of \$91 and two (2) demerit points.

When you are permitted to do a U-turn, you must give way to all other vehicles and pedestrians even if other vehicles are facing a GIVE WAY or STOP sign.

Should there not be a sign permitting you to do a U-Turn at traffic lights, negotiate another route to allow you to turn around legally and safely. It may be as simple as turning right at the next intersection.

### When making a U-turn you must:

- have a clear view of approaching traffic
- do so without obstructing the free movement of traffic and that includes motorists positioned in traffic behind you
- give way to all vehicles and pedestrians

### You must not do a U-Turn:

- Across a single or double continues centre line or a continuous centre line to the left of a broken light.
- Over a painted island in the centre of the road.

### Kuranda Water Reservoir Project – Myola Road

Mareeba Shire Council would like to inform residents that construction works are proposed to start early December for the Construction of a new Water Reservoir on the existing Myola Road Water Reservoir site. Works are expected to continue until June 2015.

Mareeba Shire Council will have a contractor working on constructing a new water reservoir and upgrading water reticulation networks on a short section of Myola Rd and running a new water reticulation main along Kuranda Heights Rd.

Mareeba Shire Council identified the need for an additional water storage reservoir at Kuranda on Myola Road to meet current and future water storage requirements, in order to achieve required storage and fire reserves. The new reservoir will allow Council to meet its legislative and safety requirements under the "Water Act 2000" and the "Water Supply (Safety Reliability) Act 2008".

The main area of disturbance on the water reservoir site will be kept to a minimum however to enable the construction of the water reservoir several trees will have to be removed. Whilst removal of the trees is regrettable, disturbance of the area will be kept to a minimum.

Please be advised that there could be changed traffic conditions to Myola Road and Kuranda Heights Rd during these works. Please drive to conditions, heed traffic

management directions and value the safety of our workers.

# An Englishman (omes to the Village Brian Reeves


Let me introduce our Profile of the Month – Brian Reeves. He is an Englishman who was born in Stamford Rivers in Essex. His Dad was an estate groundsman. Unfortunately his Mother died when he was quite young, so Brian was brought up by his aunt and her husband in Birmingham. Brian went on to spend most of his life in England, apart from a period overseas with the RAF. We will come to that later. He is, with his family, a comparative late-comer to Kuranda, but has settled in very well. A cheery, generous man, he is easy to get to know. I was moved to profile him, as he and his wife Brenda are marvellous volunteers in the folding of this paper on the last Thursday morning each month. They have taken on more than their fair share of that work. Unfortunately due to family circumstances this has had to be reduced lately and now we need more paper folders. But that is another story.

Brian was educated in Birmingham and then at a Grammar School in Staffordshire. Leaving school, he worked for some brewers for a year and a half before his National Service came up. He was in the RAF for three years. He sailed to Iraq in 1952 and served on protection duty for a while before being put in charge of administration at the Air HQ Unit as a Sergeant. During this time he had an adventure over the Iraq/Turkey border and also attended an amazing funeral in Mosul, places that these days are not really safe.

Returning to England, he joined the City of Birmingham Police Force in 1954 until resigning

two years later. Then he worked as a sales manager with various companies, starting with Super Oil Seals and Gaskets. In 1958 he met Brenda at an old time dancing event, but did not get to dance with her until later. They were married in July 1958. They have a son and daughter. In 1962 he tried his hand at his own business by buying a general store, but this was later sold due to pending developments. Brian returned to sales managerial jobs with various companies, working in office supplies and then survey equipment. He had to be conversant with complicated instruments on which he had to offer tuition. He describes some most unusual deliveries and experiences.

Then the family took a break down south when he went on a sailing cruiser for six months. Back to work, he had further sales managerial jobs, involving automatic shut down valves, miniature gas detection equipment and aspirator integrated detection weapons. In 1986 he decided to go into business again for himself with his son in



Bournemouth. He set up as an estate agent, and gradually expanded the business until he had 10 offices. The business was sold in 1991 after his doctor told him to slow down.

During this time he joined the Freemasons for the first time, and has been a member ever since. He has held the office of District Senior Grand Warden, and is currently an Assistant Grand Superintendant of Works. This involves raising money for charities. At one stage in England he helped raise one million pounds for medical equipment, taking on the challenge of pulling a 747 along the runway. He would like to help form a Lodge of Freemasons in Kuranda and is looking for people interested. He says the Freemasons are now much more open.

Brian worked for a stonemason for a while as an area manager and then helped a funeral director open a new business. Then it came time to retire. He and his wife had a world tour, which involved coming to Perth in 2005. They motor-homed the West coast, caught the train eastwards and then motor-homed up to Cairns. They liked it up north, in particular at Kuranda. Returning to England with good news, his daughter came over to Australia to check it out. They decided to all move to North Queensland and look for a caravan park or something similar to buy. But the prices were too high so they brought their present acreage in Kuranda and extended the house. The daughter lives at one end, Brian and Brenda at the other end.

Brian has three grandchildren and one very young great grandchild. Due to a disability, Brian and Brenda have to look after this very young child, leaving little time for anything else. But they have been active in the community. Apart from paper volunteers and Freemasons, they are KNC volunteers and are also active in the Anglican Church. Brian has a Christian outlook on life, endeavouring to help others where he can and to cheer people up. It is a tolerant version of Christianity, respecting the right of others to their own life and thought.



# What's (hristmas Without Beetles?

Summer in Australia is signified by all sorts of occurrences in nature, but one which many people identify with is the appearance of Christmas beetles. These lovers of eucalypt leaves often emerge in early summer, coinciding with Christmas, and are frequently seen together in large numbers, decorating gum trees in their own unique way.

Christmas beetles belong to the scarab family of beetles. We have over thirty species of Christmas beetles living in Australia. Many are found along the east coast, and in some regions have become more abundant where land clearing has provided extra grasslands for them to reproduce in.

The life cycle of these beetles is the same basic cycle as most beetles. In this case, eggs are laid underground in grasslands adjacent to eucalypt trees or forests. The grubs (larvae) feed upon grass roots and their growth is dependant on soil temperature. Those in warmer climates may emerge a year later, whilst those in cooler regions may spend two years underground. The larvae are crescent-shaped with a pale, reddish-brown head and three pairs of legs, but can be quite difficult to distinguish from other beetle larvae.

After pupating, the adults time their emergence with warmer conditions and are also stimulated by rainfall. Different species will emerge at different times throughout the summer; perhaps to avoid direct competition. Other factors can influence the exact timing of their emergence, such as seasonal variations in weather patterns. Most Christmas beetles emerge from November to February, but as we know, many appear in late December.

Christmas beetles are good flyers and can cover distances of several kilometres. Many fly at dusk, but they are often attracted to lights after dark and can end up buzzing around the front porch.

Adult beetles are voracious leaf-feeders and often congregate in groups to feed and find mates in a wide variety of gum trees. Such is their tendency to cluster that hundreds can be found in a single tree, while an identical adjacent tree can be empty. While on occasions these beetles can cause damage to trees, most will usually recover. As is repeatedly the case, the increasing severity of the impact of the beetles on some trees is the result of human ecological disturbance – the depletion of forests and the increase in grasslands as Christmas beetle breeding sites.

### **How High the Cost?**

### TRAGEDIES IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE KURANDA RANGE RAILWAY

Without a doubt the construction of the railway line over the Kuranda Range was a significant engineering feat that would present problems even for modern engineers and today's well equipped construction companies.

The range section, from Redlynch to Myola, was known as the "second section", and involved constructing a line rising over 1,500 feet (323 metres)

Unfortunately, the cost of this project in human life and health was significant. The Cairns Post of 4 May 1887 carried an advertisement calling for 503 navvies to work on the second section of the line. Wages would range from 7 shillings to 9 shillings per day. Eventually over one thousand men worked on the line at times, and quite a few were killed or maimed.

The first fatal accident recorded on this section was on 26 May 1887. Gavin Hamilton, a twenty-three-year-old from Paisley in England, worked as a clearer. His job was to clear the trees and scrub from the route prior to the beginning of the earthworks. He and another man were engaged in burning off the cleared timber near Beard's cutting, and while Hamilton was rolling a log into the fire at the bottom of the gully he lost his balance and fell head first into the fire. His companion was severely burned trying to save him but was unsuccessful.

Other workers rushed to help, but by the time they arrived it was too late. As *The* Cairns Post reported it: "Hamilton was by this time reduced to a cinder."

When an accident such as this happens now the subsequent inquiry can be a lengthy affair, often taking over one year to finalise. In contrast, our ancestors were quick to deal with such matters. Hamilton's body was taken by stretcher to Hart's Hotel at Barronville, "...the proprietor with his usual kindness at once placing a room at the disposal of the contractors."

The accident happened at about 4.00pm, and at 8.00pm a magisterial inquiry was held by M. Meston, J. P., and Gavin Hamilton was buried next day at the Cairns Cemetery.

The construction of the cuttings and tunnels saw an increase in accidents, with faulty explosions and falling rocks. The Capricornian, a Rockhampton paper, reported on 30 July 1887 that John Willoughby "met with a sudden and terrible death at the entrance to No. 7 tunnel." While Willoughby was charging a hole for blasting a stone fell into the hole half-way down. This prevented the powder from getting to the bottom of the hole, and Willoughby tried to remove the stone with an iron scraper. The report stated: "The scraper evidently struck a spark from the rock, and the blast exploded, blowing the poor fellow several yards away, burning his body fearfully, and burying a fragment of stone in his breast. He only breathed about ten minutes after the accident."

Not all casualties were recorded in the local press, and some were reported in more detail than others. Some of the casualties recorded in this report were sourced from southern papers, but appeared to have not been recorded in *The Cairns Post*, the local paper. The reason for this omission is unclear.

Martin Brennan, 40 years old, from Ireland, and Alexander Corbett, 25 years old, from Ross-shire in Scotland, died instantly in the accident. Although the doctor was

The bodies were taken to Dillon's Hotel where suitable clothes were made available for the burial. A special funeral train was sent to take the bodies to Cairns for burial. The train stopped at the McLeod Street Cemetery where both men were interred. Reverend Father J.P. Crane, of the Roman Catholic Church officiated at Martin Brennan's burial, and Reverend R. Newell of the Primitive Methodist Church performed the rites for Alexander Corbett.

railway it would appear that the contractors were not employing enough experienced miners. North Queensland was home to many experienced underground miners with expertise in blasting, so the apparent scarcity of competent men on the project seems to indicate that the contractors were not willing to pay for experience. This opinion

is supported by the fact that after many accidents the contractors started to advertise for experienced miners.

Another blasting accident took the life of Patrick Stapleton in February 1888. Stapleton was described as a navvy, which was the term for a railway labourer, so he evidently did not have mining experience.

He was working near Stoney Creek Falls when a shot misfired during blasting operations. Stapleton "jumped out" the hole and was given some dynamite to reload. The hole suddenly exploded, and it was later assumed that there was still some powder in the hole, and it was somehow ignited. Stapleton's head was almost blown off, and his eyes and nose were gone.

in 13.5 miles (21.7 kilometres), with the construction of 15 tunnels and 30 bridges. The fact that this second section of the line was finished in only four years by men using mainly picks, shovels, wheelbarrows, hand drills and basic explosives is testament to the skill and tenacity of the early pioneers.

He died instantly. Ironically, another man usually fired the shots in this gang, but he was absent that day and Stapleton took his place. His body was placed in a coffin

The Cairns Post reported that: "When the coffin was being taken from the van, a double line of people formed between the train and the gateway, there being about fifty people present, including a number of navvies, the friends of the deceased."

Stapleton was aged 41, and was from Parsontown, King's County, Ireland. He had been twenty years in Australia, and had worked in Victoria, New South Wales and South Australia before coming to Queensland.

Despite the high casualty record on the project, little seems to have been done to rectify the situation. In March 1888 another young man met his death on the line. Thomas Hughes was killed at no. 4 tunnel. His workmates took his body by trolley car to Redlynch, from where it was conveyed to Cairns by train. He was buried in the Cairns Cemetery with the others killed on the line.

In early August 1888 The Cairns Post reported that Patrick Tarvey was killed at the Red Bluff on the second section. Tarvey had been working alone on Saturday, which was pay day for the navvies. As he had recently started on the job he had no pay to draw, so elected to work rather than have time off.

He was pressing loose stone from the cutting with a crowbar when the face fell away. He was flung about 400 feet and severely hurt. He was still alive when found and Dr. Mackenzie was summonsed, but nothing could be done for him. Tarvey died within an hour of his fall.

Despite the number of deaths on the line the local press appeared to be content to merely report the incidents without commenting on the tragedy of such a loss of life. Some of the reports in *The Cairns* Post merely recorded the bare facts, without elaboration of the circumstances, and even failed to mention some accidents resulting in fatalities.

However, this apparent disinterest in criticising the poor safety record of the constructing contractors changed on 22 September 1888 when the paper reported: "On Thursday one more victim was added to the list of those who have met their deaths on the second section.

"An Italian ganger, named John Zappa, one of two brothers on the line, fell from a cutting near Camp Oven Creek and rolled several hundred feet into the bed of the Barron.

"He was dead when picked up, and his body was brought into Cairns yesterday by train, being followed by nearly all the Italians on the line."

Less than one week later there were two accidents on the line at almost the same time and about two miles apart.

The most serious accident occurred at No. 77 cutting when Jas. Doyle, a powder monkey, was preparing a hole for blasting. He was working about 70 feet up the slope loading "rackarock" explosive into the hole.

The rackarock stuck as he was pushing it down into the hole, and he used a steel scraper to force it down. The use of iron scrapers for this purpose was banned, and wooden rammers were supplied.

As he withdrew the scraper the charge detonated and a large quantity of rock and earth was thrown down onto the men working below. They tried to flee but three were killed by the falling debris.

They were: John Cull, from Northern Ireland, and Antonio Raffaele and Lisidiai Dunouro, both from Italy.

All were single men and had been employed on the job for some months. Rescuers dug for about ten minutes to extricate the men. Raffaele had a broken back and died instantly. Cull had severe head injuries and lived only about ten minutes after being freed, and Dunouro lived for about one hour before expiring.

The second accident occurred at the Bluff and was also caused by premature explosion. William Rose, who was experienced in explosives, was charging a hole with his workmate, an Italian named Aremegro Citroni.

They were working 30 feet up the embankment when the rackarock stuck in the hole. Rose used a wooden rod to send it down but the charge exploded prematurely.

Both men were knocked some distance down the slope and Rose received a broken leg and other injuries when boulders rolled over him.

Although Citroni fell about 20 feet he was unhurt, and helped other men to carry Rose to safety and treatment.

Rackarock was a new explosive and had been in use on the second section for a short time. The Magisterial inquiry into the accidents concluded that the explosive probably became more unstable with heat, and the working conditions on the site Continued on Page 24 exacerbated the danger.

On 14 November 1887 two men were killed at No. 4 tunnel when about 10 feet of

Work accidents weren't the only cause of death on the second section, however. The Cairns Post of 26 October 1887 reported that Samuel Scalby, a ganger on the line was bitten on the calf of the leg by a black snake. He died within

an hour of being bitten.

On 3 November 1888 a powder monkey named Walter Cornell, who was about 30 years old, was killed when his head was crushed when he fell.

Just after noon Cornell set four charges on a batter about 50 feet above the formation level. He called out "fire" to warn other workers that an explosion was imminent.

The ganger, Joseph Steele, went in one direction to warn other away while another man, Joseph Piper, was sent in the opposite direction for the same purpose. Steele heard all shots explode and went back to his camp for lunch.

On returning to work at one o'clock the men found Cornell lying dead on the formation level.

It was believed that after he lit the fuse he slipped while getting away from the blast. Apparently he fell 50 feet to the formation and landed on his head. He was born in England, and came direct to Cairns to work on the line.

The accident rate did not improve as the line progressed. On 7 August 1889 *The Cairns Post* reported another fatal accident:

"On Saturday afternoon Surprise Creek was the scene of an accident by which the lives of two men were added to the holocaust of the second section of the Cairns-Herberton railway, while a third lies in the Cairns Hospital in a painful condition.

"Whether the terrible frequency of accidents is due to a want of proper supervision in the way of blasting and tunnelling operations, or whether a want of knowledge in the use of explosives, or carelessness on the part of the men themselves while at work attended by danger, is to blame is a moot question; public opinion on the line inclining to the latter theory. But whatever the cause, the results are equally deplorable."

The men were killed by a premature explosion, probably caused when the powder they were loading into a hole was ignited by heat from a previous explosion. William Smith was killed instantly by the blast and W. Sullivan was found about 40 feet from the explosion. He was caught by a rock when his body was flung down the batter, and he lingered for five hours before succumbing to his injuries. P. Haggerty was seriously injured and had damage to one eye.

The bodies of the deceased were carried to Cairns by their friends, and the Railway Department was widely criticised for not supplying a train to transport the bodies.

August 1889 was a bad month for accidents on the line. The Cairns Post reported on 20 August that "An Italian was killed yesterday morning while felling trees on the second section of the Cairns-Herberton railway." The paper failed to give his name or other details. Ten days later another Italian, Citroni Giovanni was injured when a stone was dislodged from above him and struck him on the head.

He rolled 40 feet down the embankment after the impact. He lingered until the next day and died from a fractured skull.

A fractured skull was also the cause of death of John Kehoe on 19 December 1889. He was working at Camp Oven Creek and it was assumed that he fell from a cutting and smashed his head while returning from his work at dinner time. His body was not discovered for many hours.

He was described as a steady, sober man. He had accumulated savings of £600, a small fortune in those days. His friends thought he had been planning a trip to the "old country" soon.

On 18 January 1890 another employee on the line expired from a fractured skull. He was described as "an elderly man named Waters", and it was surmised that a stone fell from above and struck him on the head. He was taken to the Cairns Hospital where he died two days later.

At least one man who should have been a statistic defied the odds and lived to tell the tale. On 14 June 1890 *The Cairns Post* reported: "That it is better to be born lucky than rich, was well exemplified on Monday, when a man named Richard Newbury, a fine young fellow of magnificent physique, slipped off Stoney Creek bridge on the second section, and fell a distance of some 50 feet.

"His mates, seeing the fall, expected to gather up the fragments that remained, but to their utter astonishment found him very little the worse for his disaster. It appears that after dropping 25 feet his fall was broken by a protruding ledge, so that, the next drop of 25 feet was not of material importance.

"Dr. Dobie reports no broken bones and no internal injuries, although (says the doctor) by rights he should have dislocated his hip, broken his leg in three places, smashed his sternum, stove in his head, fractured his ribs, and broken his neck."

The construction of the Kuranda Range Railway probably cost many more lives than those recorded here. Apart from the number of accidents recorded there were many suicides in North Queensland in that period. The workforce was predominantly young, single, and many were far from home and family. The extremely hard work in an unfriendly tropical environment, coupled with loneliness and alcohol took its toll on the workers. We will never know how many of these men chose to take their own lives.

# Inside My Studio

Interview and Photograph by Toni Rogers

I was first introduced to the artwork of Kuranda artist **David Stacey** about 15 years ago when I stood mesmerised in front of his large colourful paintings in an exhibition in Cairns. David's use of intricately drawn patterns vary to create contrast and also help define the natural pattern of an animal or bird, nests, feathers, stones, fruit, leaves and insects included in the illustration. His added colours are vivid, carefully chosen and true to the colours of our environment. David's limited edition prints are produced by the giclee (pronounced "zhee-klay") printing process. The quality of giclee printing rivals and exceeds that of the traditional printing and is commonly found in museums, art galleries worldwide.

Primarily considered a painter, his pen and ink works appear in various publications such as scientific journals and university texts. David Stacey has had over twenty successful solo exhibitions in Australia and Japan. David is an artist of genuine repute, his name is synonymous with the genre of fine art, the work speaks for itself. A visit to his Kuranda art gallery never disappoints.

### Where is your current studio?

At the moment I haven't a permanent studio as I am house sitting. None the less, I have a space to work at night. During the day, when time permits, I can do my artwork in my gallery in Coondoo Street, Kuranda, mainly pen and ink works and preliminary drawings as it is easier to 'stop/start' with pens and pencils unlike painting. Water colours are far harder as the paint dries quickly.

### Do you work alone or with others?

I have always worked alone. It has its advantages such as not being disturbed. The downside is it's a very solitary existence and sometimes makes me think it would be great to work with other artists.

### What are the essential features your studio has to have?

A small drawing table specific for illustrations would be great and an easel for working on stretched canvases. I also need a good light over my left shoulder.

### Describe your work pattern - hours/days/weeks.

Erratic at the best of times but I have always found the night to be the optimal time, with no distractions except for my music, which is essential. I sit in a bubble of light, everything else is redundant.

### Describe the works you do in your studio.

I am working on a book and have been for over two years. It is a big project and will take another two years to finish. This takes up most of my time.

### Why is visual art your chosen medium?

Good question! When I was a child my mother introduced me to story books such as Grimm's Fairy Tales. These were first published in 1812 and all editions were extensively illustrated. I was always fascinated by the pen and ink illustrations. The work of Pixie O'Harris, writer and illustrator, comes to mind also. Later in my early teens I got lost in "Caption Good Vibes" a comic book in its time. The illustrations really inspired me. So I guess pen and ink was my first medium to work with, then later came water colours and pen and ink, then acrylics.





### **Safety Upgrades Continue On Kuranda Range Road**



Work to widen the inside of a tight curve at the bottom of Kuranda Range Road has begun.

The widening work will improve safety for road users and is due for completion before Christmas, weather permitting.

With the wet season fast approaching, crews will also be installing soil nails and barriers to reduce the risk and impact of landslips.

Soil nails are steel reinforcement bars used to stabilise areas where landslides might be a problem.

Landslips can close the road for days at a time, which causes huge disruptions for commuters, businesses and tourism and transport operators.

For the safety of workers and road users, changed traffic conditions will be in place for the duration of the


The works will require a single lane closure, which will be managed by manually-controlled traffic signals.

### Yellow Crazy Ant Treatment Update For Russett Park

Russett Park residents in yellow crazy ant treatment areas should see a gradual decline in yellow crazy ant numbers by late November.

The second round of yellow crazy ant treatments for 2014 was completed the week ending 14 November and residents should see a gradual decline in yellow crazy ant numbers by late November and over the three months that follow.

The Russett Park area was treated with Engage P, an insect growth regulator designed to sterilise the yellow crazy ant queens to prevent reproduction. The ants live their normal short life of about three months, then die of old age. Where the worker ants have taken the bait to the nest and fed the queens, ants and queens are not replaced and the nest is eradicated. However, this doesn't always happen and sometimes a new queen is in the pupae stage and is not susceptible. As a result, multiple treatments are required to eliminate infestations.

Wet Tropics Management Authority executive director, Andrew Maclean thanked residents for their cooperation once again.

"The cooperation of residents in infested areas has been excellent, but we ask that you remain vigilant to ensure infestations are not spread further.

"Take all green waste to council waste transfer stations where it is monitored for yellow crazy ants and electric ants. Illegal dumping of green waste, timber and rubbish from around the yard greatly increases the risk of spreading yellow crazy ants.

"If you live in a yellow crazy ant treatment area and are moving house, contact the Authority or Biosecurity Queensland for a free inspection of pot plants, outdoor furniture and other potential risk items," Mr Maclean added.

### **Hydroponic Gardening**

I went away for a month from September to October but have now replanted and everything is doing fine. I have Tomatoes – Roma – and some special purple cherry tomatoes that are about an inch across.

In summer I just have to go up to the garden to make a salad. I have a variety of lettuce, tomatoes, cucumbers, herbs, chinese vegetables, beans and carrots. The beans I grow are bush beans which do not require a trellis and you only need about three and keep planting them every few weeks.

### Why Grow Plants Hydroponically?

There are quite a few advantages:

- Space: You don't need a lot of space but you do need natural light. When they are grown indoors you require lights, pumps, extractor fans etc.
- · Waist height: Enables people who have bad backs to continue gardening. There is no digging
- It is easy to pull up weeds from sand.
- Cats and Dogs: Most animals can't reach them. My husband built a frame covered with bird netting to keep the birds off the tomatoes and small seedlings.
- · Water Use: Instead of standing with a hose you

only need enough water for the individual plants.

Tomatoes require about one litre each a day. Most plants are capillary fed so they only use what they require. Some people think hydroponic gardening is not natural but most of my formula consists of what is in our bore water. It contains Calcium, Magnesium, iron, boron copper etc.

· Containers: I use mostly recycled containers. The lettuce grow in channels with a lid on and holes cut out for the pots. Tomatoes in 25L containers and

herbs in polystyrene boxes which have previously held broccoli. These containers are very useful for most plants.

Cost: Nutrient solutions for small hydroponic systems can often be adequately prepared by adding additional components to standard general fertiliser (Aquasol or Phostogen), five parts Gypsum, one part Epsom Salts, six parts soluble plant food. This mixture can be used at one teaspoon for lettuce and two level teaspoons for tomatoes per five litres of water. Tomatoes

are heavy feeders. I make the nutrient formula up in bulk: it depends on how much you want to grow.

### What is Freemasonry?

**THAT** is a question that cannot be answered in a few words, there is a lot of ground to cover and with the editors permission I would like to undertake several articles which I trust will explain Freemasonry and the help and service it gives. So what is it?

Freemasons meet in buildings plainly identified as Masonic Centres and public announcements of their meetings are often published in daily and community publications. There is no attempt to hide the names of community leaders who are Freemasons.

To convey the messages Freemasonry has to give and for the uniformity of presentation in our ceremonies we use a ritual - an oral tradition of storytelling that has been passed down the generations for hundreds of years. Our ritual is often considered by Freemasons as being the most colourful and interesting method of imparting the lessons and values of The Craft. We employ the tools of the stone mason as symbols of basic moral truths and our Masonic ritual dramatises a philosophy of life based on morality.

The fraternity of Freemasonry encourages selfimprovement, promotes patriotism and respect for the rule of law, sanctions equal rights under law, practices good will towards all men, and contributes generously to worthy causes. Masonic Charities are renowned world-wide for work with medical research and other noble purposes.

When masons say world wide, that is what Freemasonry is, when a Freemason visits another country he will be welcomed into their Lodges. He may find variations to the ritual he is used to, but in the main, even if he does not speak the language he will be able to follow the meeting. After the meeting there is usually a festive board, it may be a plain fare of sandwiches and cakes, right through to a full three course meal. It is in this atmosphere of leisure that a raffle may be held to raise money for charitable donations to be made to worthy causes. These are usually included in the local press, watch the Cairns Post but more often you will see wider coverage in the Tableland Newspapers.

It will be my pleasure in future articles to take the interested reader deeper into Freemasonry.

Congratulations To All Community Groups: Too numerous to mention every community group within the Kuranda District, but thank you all for the tremendous work you do for our community. There is so much passion and genuine contribution within our community: your efforts are often somewhat unseen, but make such a difference to our community.

**Therwine Street Upgrade:** Consultation on the project is about to commence. The project is funded by Infrastructure funds and will provide for the upgrade to Therwine Street, the undergrounding of power lines and improvements to the streetscape.

**Tourism Kuranda:** The Tourism Kuranda Advisory Committee is currently considering their recommendation to Council regarding the Kuranda Benefitted Area Rate for 2015-16. Committee members are seeking feedback from commercial property owners in the Kuranda Village area. The Tourism Kuranda office has now moved to the site of the old Visitors Centre.

**Kuranda Community Precinct:** At a recent Council Meeting, the Development Application to proceed with the first stage of the redevelopment of the Precinct was approved. The Architect plans for the new Library have been approved and works are expected to commence soon. The old PreSchool site has now been sold and all funds will go into a special reserve to fund the further development of the Precinct. Members of the Advisory Committee are now focused on the Master Plan for the future plans for the whole of the Precinct area.

Know what you will do in the event of an emergency or an evacuation. The time to get ready is now. Council has a comprehensive Disaster Management Plan and staff have been trained in readiness. you would go if your home was not safe or you were asked to leave your home before a cyclone. Have those important phone numbers ready!

**Construction Work Intersection Rob Veivers Drive & Morton Street:** Construction works at the intersections are now complete and residents are reminded of the new arrangements for traffic exiting and entering Morton St from Rob Veivers Drive. The signage to indicate the changes will be installed soon.

It was an awe inspiring sight to see several hundred passengers ferried smoothly and quickly from the P&O luxury liner, Pacific Dawn, to the Yorkeys Knob foreshore last week, in the beautiful tropical sunshine.

Until now, it has been a major operation to disembark and embark passengers from cruise

ships mooring off Yorkeys. A great deal of time was spent waiting at the old small jetty in full sun, to board the tenders ferrying them back to their ships. Swift transfers to and from shore, and more efficient flow of buses means more time for cruise ship passengers to explore further afield than the immediate environs of Yorkeys Knob. This of course means more tourism dollars for Kuranda and more people carrying word back to friends overseas about the magic of your village in the rainforest.

More than \$2.2 million has been spent on the upgrades, a joint venture between Ports North, Yorkeys Knob Boating Club and State Government. I am very proud to have been instrumental in bringing this about.



Mulching is important right now, while it is so dry and hot. When we do get rain, clearing the mulch from around your plants will allow the water to reach the soil.

### RENEWAL - REVITALISATION - REJUVENATION - Expansion

This is what is happening to Kuranda Conservation Community Nursery (KCons), thanks to the great men and women who have come to us through JobFind. We are fortunate to be the Kuranda base for participants to learn nursery procedures and practices. This necessarily embraces broader conservation matters such as plant identification, seed collection and selecting the right species for the right locations. New nursery benches are being erected to take the increasing number of plants being propagated. Most of our plants have been potted into larger containers allowing the size of our plants to explode. We still have the smaller \$2 tube stock but there is now an awesome. array of advanced plants - that's new for us!



They're out and about digging up your vegetable and flower gardens, looking for worms. But there is a remedy:

Lay chicken mesh flat on your garden bed. You can use any old chicken wire and it doesn't have to be strong. A big-hole mesh is very effective in preventing the bandicoots from digging up your plants. If you're preparing a new garden bed, you might consider laying the wire mesh as the finishing touch and planting through the

If you need to lay the mesh on an established garden, the thin wire is fairly easy to cut around each plant. Yes, it's a bit fussy but it will save your plants. It might also help to pin the mesh down with wire bent like a tent peg, or just weigh it down with

BUT, before you start filling up all the holes they've made, use the fact that they've done all the hard work and fill the holes with water. If II get right to where you want it, at the roots of the clants. Then fill in the holes and lay the mesh.

Pythons love cats. For the sake of your cat (and precious wildlife), keep it indoors at all times.

Snake Removal: Snakes are fully active now, and will be drawn to your chook house or quinea pig hutch. They love the heat of your ceiling cavity where it's safe and dry to shed their skin. Keeping them out of your ceiling space can be a bit tricky. They'll be looking for any overhanging tree branches to get access to your roof. A 4m python has quite a good reach, so ensure there is no way they can get up there.

Most of the time they just go about their business and are not interested in you at all. It's natural to be fearful but usually unfounded. If you simply can't live with them, call Jax on 4093 8834 to have them relocated. Please don't try to kill them - that's when you might come off second best.

### From the Birders' Diary

Kuranda Envirocare was successful in obtaining a Birds of Australia grant: there was great excitement all around. The grant will allow further analysis and web publication of the natural recovery of rainforest bird species in Envirocare plantings which range from 6 months to 25 plus years in age.





Flocks containing several species of insectivorous rainforest birds like the spectacled monarch (left) and pale yellow robin (right) have been seen in plantings of all ages this year, with some pairs starting to nest. Noted for its late arrival this year, possibly due to the late storm season, is the migrant paradise kingfisher, hopefully returning next month.


