

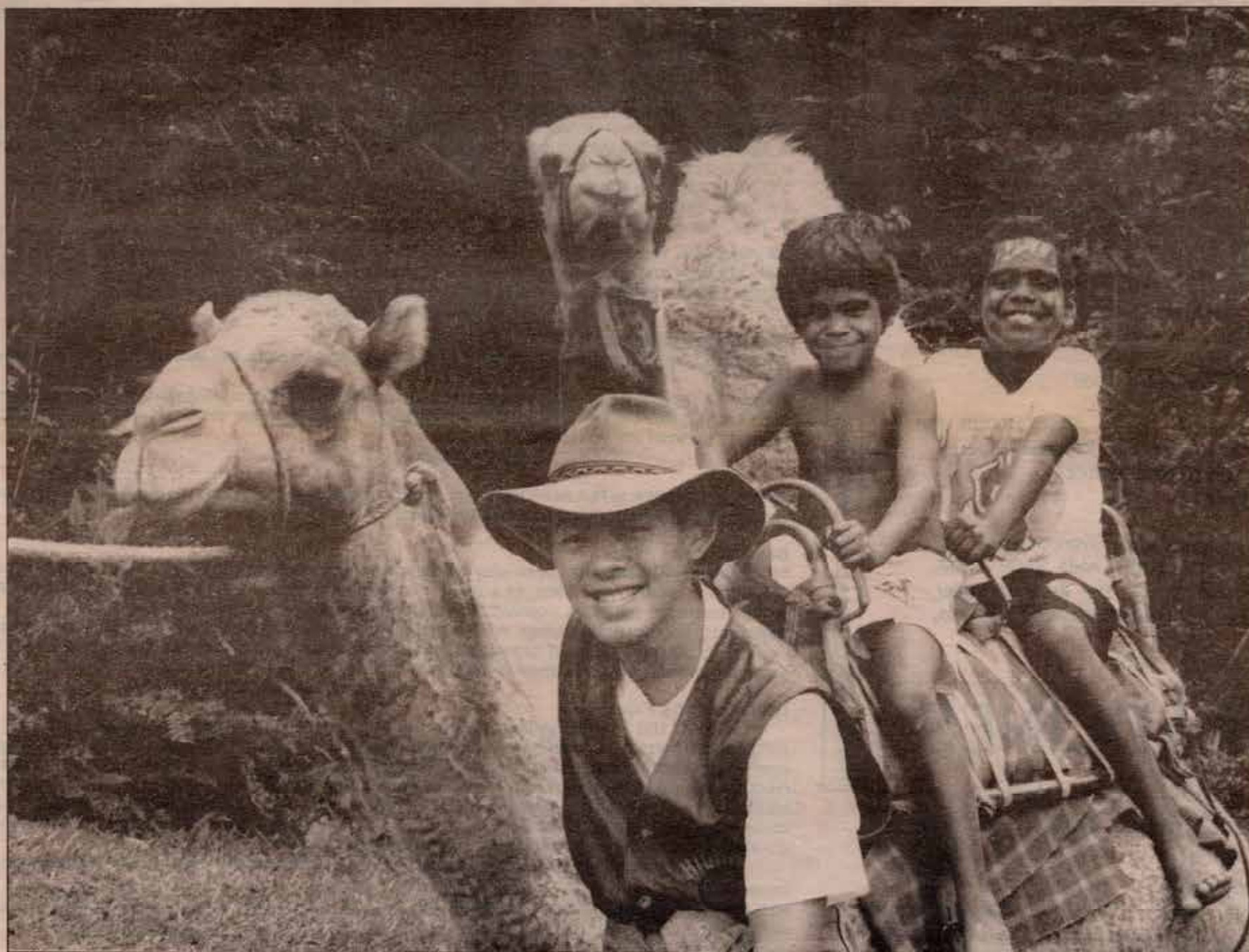

Local Government Commissioner Greg Hoffman has extended five options to the residents of Cairns and Mulgrave Shires regarding future external boundaries of those shires. This fifth option has very little chance of occurring.

Dear Kuranda Paper,

On Saturday 30th April and Monday 2nd May, there was a display at the Kuranda Primary School of the Kuranda Village Master Plan.

I would like to congratulate the Council on seeing the vision workshop through to this state. Council has had plans prepared in accordance with the Kuranda Strategic Management plan, to guide civic improvements to the Kuranda Village. The Master plan has many positive points, especially in the area of better traffic management and beautification of the village, with more emphasis on tree planting widening of the footpaths and upgrading the main street. The plan calls for a 12 metre pedestrian and dining area for the north side of Coondoo Street and car parking and a stone faced retaining wall on the South Side. This wall is intended to raise the south street level to the level of the North Sides's new 12 metre footpath and dining area. I would suggest that there are very good reasons for having a wide pedestrian and dining area on both sides of the street.

1. It would look more attractive and balanced.
2. It would allow for imminent development of the South Side.
3. Equal scattering of the car parking helps with loading and unloading and short duration customer parking. This arrangement would not appreciable alter the plan or effect the pedestrian traffic, any more than would the areas of tables and chairs already planned on the North Side.
4. The council will have planned the project once and for all and would not have to do it again at a later date. This saves a lot of cost and inconvenience for Kuranda Residents.
5. Dining areas on the south side should be developed and in the meantime used for other activities, such as entertaining and tourist rest area.
6. This allows more extensive landscapes on both sides of Coondoo Street.

As you know, we are living in a well developed country and we should make decisions with long term strategy and without any doubt, both sides of Coondoo Street will be developed in the near future and the footpath and street will remain for new generations.

In 1923 the Hunter family built what was to become "The Hunter Bros General Store" in 1981 my partners and I purchased the building and converted it to Frogs restaurant, it has grown over the years and has been improved and propped up. As many of you are now aware Frogs restaurant is to be re-placed by a new development comprising of a number of shops, licensed restaurant and coffee shop plus a tropical courtyard with a live display of tree-frogs and arts and crafts retailing area. We intend to use artistic and historical themes in this project and hopefully set a standard with our development that enhances Kuranda village.

Plans for construction are nearly complete and emphasis has been placed on the overall impact that the new structure will have on the streetscape and character of our village. This will be a high quality project and will attract experienced owners and tenants. Timber will be used extensively and recycling of materials from Frogs, so as to retain the ambience of this development, will be seriously looked at.

I like many other long term residents of Kuranda am a little surprised at the quantity of new commercial space recently developed or under development at present. The Mareeba Health Action Group invites the residents of Kuranda to attend a public meeting to be held Wednesday 8th June 7pm at the Mareeba Shire Hall. It is imperative that we get your support to stop the downgrading of Mareeba Hospital. The Regional Health Authority has a plan which will result in:

1. There being only 48 general acute adult beds (previously 64). Overflow is economically impossible, staff have been promised to the Aged Care assessment Team.
2. For the first time in the history of Mareeba Hospital patients will need to be turned away.
3. There has been no community consultation. Consultation has consisted of seeking ratification for decisions already made.
4. Funding has not been documented for the aged Care assessment Unit, and one must assume from this that the project is to be funded out from existing Hospital budget.

We will not be intimidated by the Regional Health Authority. Please support your hospital, our hospital.

MAKING TRACKS

with Cnr Oliver Gilkerson

Over the last month Council activity has concentrated on preparations for the 1994/95 Council budget. Over the next month a draft budget will be finalised in readiness for budget sessions at which final expenditure and revenue raising decisions will be made.

In terms of expenditure two for the most significant spending areas are Council's administration budget including salaries and property servicing costs and the roads budget including construction works, resealing of roads and roads maintenance. Previously, revenues raised in Division 4 have been expended on Council works within Division 4 other than in relation to Council's administration budget. At present the proportion by which the Divisions contribute to the overall administration costs of the Shire is equivalent to the value which all rateable land in a Division relates to the total value of all rateable land in the Shire as a whole. I am advised that under this formula revenues from Division 4 constitute something in the order of 43% of the Council's administration budget. This is directly attributable to the higher values of land in Division 4 and particularly in the Kuranda area.

Both Cr. Rose and myself will be seeking a review of the formula by which the Divisions contribute to Council's administration budget in the coming financial year. It is hoped that Council will introduce a more equitable means for assessing the proportion of the administration budget which Division 4 contributes.

In any event the introduction of the new Local Government Act will see some important changes in the way in which all future budgets are formulated. For example accrual rather than a cash basis to budgeting will be introduced to ensure that depreciation of Council plant and equipment is taken into account year by year. Another example is the move away from Divisional accounting. Whilst Divisional accounting will not be contained within the budget, separate records on a Divisional basis will continue to be maintained.

Two hard working local committees have achieved special progress over the last month:-

1. The Library/Community Hall Committee has completed its preliminary investigations and will report to Council shortly. Persons interested in becoming involved in this important project can contact the coordinator, Sue McArthur.
2. The Ambulance Committee is now finalising arrangements to obtain a site for the proposed ambulance centre close to the Fallon Road Sports Club. Council has offered to make available land under its trusteeship and the State government is expected to budget a sizable sum in the coming financial year for the construction of the building. The Committee is calling for more participation in this important group from within the community. The Committee meets at 7.30pm on the second Thursday of each month at Frogs restaurant.

Is Kuranda up for grabs ?

The Kuranda Paper received the following letter to the residents of Kuranda from the Mareeba Shire Council. We reprint it in full:

Review of External Boundaries - Cairns City /Mulgrave Shire & Mareeba Shire

The Local Government Commissioner is conducting a boundary review of the Cairns / Mulgrave region and Council has received advice from the Commissioner that the review has been widened to consider the potential for impact upon "neighbouring" Councils. The review provides four options and each option includes an adjustment of the boundary of this Shire which would result in Kuranda and its environs being included in a coastal Local Authority.

Council strongly opposes any change to its boundaries and wishes to retain Kuranda and environs within the Mareeba Shire. The present boundary with Mulgrave shire is along the foot of the McAllister Ranges hence the Shire has a natural boundary with coastal Local Authorities provided by:-

1. the steep escarpment of the McAllister Ranges.
2. the Wet Tropics world Heritage area which limits the coastal development to the foot of the ranges.

I would encourage residents of Kuranda to read the Boundary Review Newsletter Issue 1 which has been published by the Office of the Local Government Commissioner, available at the Kuranda Library.

Should the Kuranda area be included with a coastal Local Authority then it is almost certain that the area would not retain its existing Local Government representation. The huge number of persons on the coast would virtually prohibit a specific Kuranda Local Government representative being elected to a coastal Local Authority.

Council, in the face of great difficulties, has worked solidly towards improving public assets in the Kuranda area and has recently achieved a significant goal by having the State Government agree to the introduction of the Kuranda Rail Levy. Funds from the levy will allow Council to redevelop the Kuranda infrastructure in accordance with the Kuranda Strategic Management Plan which will preserve "the village in the rainforest".

The boundary review process is drawn to your attention because it affects your area and your opportunity to maintain direct input into your destiny.

Council will welcome your strong support for the Council position that "the boundaries of the Mareeba Shire be retained with the result that Kuranda and environs remain within the shire". Your support is essential and will be valued.

SKYRAIL

It was brought to our attention that the latest P.A.K.S newsletter carried a form letter to the federal environment minister Senator John Faulkner in which ARK was described as being strongly against the Skyrail project.

We have written to P.A.K.S informing them that: "Whilst ARK supports the work P.A.K.S has done in successfully bringing issues of concern regarding Skyrail into the public arena, and no doubt resulting in some tightening of conditions, the statement that 'the Association for Regional Kuranda' is 'strongly against the project' is misrepresentative of the situation. We do not such a blanket stance could or would be fair to our members as they have never been surveyed on their opinion either way. Our members, unlike P.A.K.S members, have not joined ARK as a single issue group and their opinions are as varied as they are individuals - and strongly respected.

It is fair and accurate to say that ARK continues to have many ongoing concerns environmental, social and economic - about the possible negative impacts of the Skyrail project and we are continuing to press for more information on these concerns. Please check with myself or Arch McArthur before making any more public statements regarding ARK's stance re Skyrail. We feel this is only fair to our members.

BOUNDARIES REVIEW

A working group has been set up to investigate and report back re the possible future external boundaries of Kuranda. This is a very important issue. See elsewhere in paper.

MAIN ST BUILDING PRACTICES

We have been very concerned to see many instances of unsafe and unacceptable construction practices in the central Village area. We have informed council of our concerns which are increased by the knowledge that further construction on the main street is imminent and may continue for another year or more. We are asking council to work with us and the business community to devise a safe and aesthetic solution to these ongoing problems.

AGM & VOTING PRECEDURES

Our next general meeting will be the last for the current committee. The general meeting will be from 7.30pm to 8.30pm June 15th. Following that, all positions will be declared vacant and the Annual General Meeting will be held. Members are asked to consider nominating for positions or to consider persons they may want to suggest nominate for the seven positions available - that is President, Secretary, Treasurer and four committee members.

Nominations will be accepted on the night. Some members of the present committee have indicated they will not be standing again and others are still considering their positions.

I'm happy to say that a year has passed since I became president and, largely due to the concerted efforts of our committee, a lot of positive change has occurred - including our own incorporation, the Kuranda Management Plan and Levy, changes in local government representation etc. It is a much more positive situation than a year ago and the potential is there for a lot more positive change.

EULOGIE TO BRIDIE

Bridie Prettejohn, daughter of Audrey and Seton Gordon, was born on 16th February 1923.

Her mother, Audrey, was a scholarly woman and a pioneer photographer. Her principles and demeanor were a lifelong inspiration to Bridie. Her father, Seton, was a celebrated naturalist and author. It was his life's pursuit that took the family to the remotest parts of Scotland. Her childhood was spent on the northern remote coast of the Isle of Skye, living in a small community of crofters at Duntulm. In Bridie's day, life in the western isles of Scotland was a simple one. The crofters were a hard working, resourceful people who possessed a strong spirit of independence and freedom. Those of us who knew Bridie will recognise these qualities!

Her childhood was spent with her sister Catriona and brother Alisdair. They had a spirit of freedom that few children have today, wandering over the moors and the mountains. They also accompanied their parents on expeditions to wild and remote places looking for Golden eagles, frequently climbing cliffs to explore rocky islands off a storm lashed coast to take some of the earliest photographs of sea bird colonies.

It was as a child that she developed her lifelong passion for horses. We can well imagine Bridie riding her tough little ponies, bareback, over the moors.

As a beautiful young bride she married High Prettejohn and moved to the farming country of Pembrokeshire in West Wales. It was here that her two children Rob and Noni were born. Her interest in country life was nurtured further at Astridge. Bridie was always meticulous in her attention to detail, she was not prepared to accept second best. This drove her on to become an expert on horses and she was always searching for new things to learn about them. Prior to coming to Australia, she travelled to East Africa. It was these travels that were the catalyst for reuniting two branches of the Prettejohn family. This has resulted in close enduring bonds between them and indeed there are members of both branches here today.

The Prettejohn family moved to Australia in 1969. Hugh and Bridie settled on a farm at Upper Barron Rd, just outside Malanda. After an unhappy period, they went their separate ways.

Bridie moved to Kuranda over 20 years ago. She established herself on a rundown property at Kuranda Heights. With her typical spirit, she turned the property into Kalinda Stud and she set off alone for America and imported some exceptional bloodstock. The horses she bred were well known throughout Queensland.

In more recent years, she turned her attention to cattle, with a particular interest in Dexter cattle. Again, single-handed, she went to Britain and brought back more exceptional stock. The cattle Bridie raised have become famous and a high proportion of the Dexter breed in Australia come from her bloodlines. Her exploits have been widely broadcast by national television appearances. During the last year, she found it increasingly difficult to manage the Dexters and reduced her herd. She was just recently nominated as a lifelong honorary member of the Dexter Association, in recognition of this remarkable achievement.

For all her achievements, Bridie was always an extremely modest, dignified and gracious woman. She was a very private person. And recently she had some very difficult decisions to make and with great courage, faced up to them and made the right decisions and won these battles. Bridie was not always effervescent, life had its ups and downs but her courage, determination and will shone through triumphantly.

On meeting Bridie for the first time, you were confronted by a person who was reserved to the point of being shy. However as friendships developed, her remarkable qualities were shared generously. As well as being very sensitive, she had a lively sense of humour and a great sense of loyalty to her friends.

Those who knew and loved Bridie are immeasurably richer for the experience. And it is in this sense that Bridie's spirit lives on, with the freedom and independence that she developed galloping over the moors on her wild ponies.

She is survived by her sister Catriona Macdonald - Lockhart, her brother Alisdair Gordon, son Robert Prettejohn, daughter Catriona Aldridge and grandchildren Emma, Sam, and Louisa Aldridge and Kimberley and Seton Prettejohn.

The reconciliation process

Reconciliation is a process which was introduced with the full support of the Federal Parliament to improve relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the wider community.

The process was set in train with the unanimous support of Federal Parliament on 5 June 1991. The aim is to achieve concrete results by the year 2001, the centenary of Federation.

The Federal Government appointed 14 indigenous people and 11 people from the wider community to the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation, to oversee the process. The Council's aims include promoting deeper understanding of indigenous issues and seeking to overcome Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander disadvantage.

The Council vision is 'a united Australia which respects this land of ours; values the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander heritage; and provides justice and equity for all.'

But the Council is not only spreading information; it also actively seeks views, ideas and action which promote reconciliation. For instance, Council committees are working in areas such as the rural and mining industries and the workplace, seeking to overcome conflict and increase co-operation and understanding.

Reconciliation cannot be achieved through the work of the Council for Aboriginal Reconciliation alone. We all need to become involved, and the Council has now established the *Australians for Reconciliation - Working Together Network* as a practical way people can join in the reconciliation process.

The contribution of churches and faith communities is a crucial part of the *Australians for Reconciliation network*.

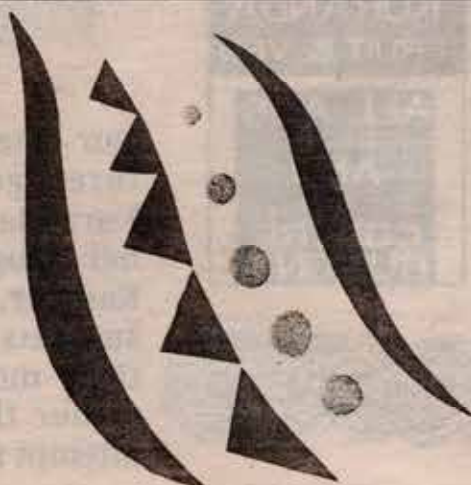

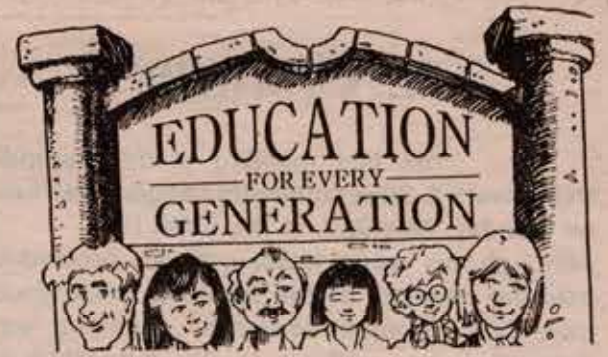

Organic Gardening

Recently the Cairns Post featured an article that suggested that the African Tulip tree should be declared a noxious weed as it was spreading like wild fire in the Mulgrave shire. This colourful tree grows quickly and huge in Kuranda streets but beware if seeds spread to your garden. I have been eradicating seedlings for years many many metres from the tree I planted 20 years ago. That tree was removed when I learnt its danger.

I have warned about **Singapore daisy**. A recent Primary Industry report states "the early popularity of this plant has turned to alarm as its vigorous growth smothers and chokes out all other herbaceous plants including low shrubs. Its use should be discouraged. It creeps and creeps and only a very expensive chemical, "Brushoff" will kill it". It can grow from a small piece so never dump it.

There are other plants that will hold soil on your banks. I can give you some: and I still have **Heliconia** roots to those that care to dig the tubes. One variety is still flowering and the honey eaters are enjoying their nectar.

Vegetables have been slow to grow with so little sunshine. **Wing beans** love the moisture and mine are producing a daily crop with no disease. Pick daily while still tender, chop small and cook them for a few minutes, they are crunchy and the young beans can be eaten raw. They do not keep well, but if you have a surplus, blanch them and then deep freeze as you would other beans.

Celery is a good vegetable to grow if given water and regular feeding. Liquid seaweed is beneficial for all vegies. To keep the celery tender suggest Hi Low milk containers with the bottom pushed out. Push the containers up when you want to cut off a few outside stalks for eating. Celery loves this weather. I bought some very young seedlings about a month ago (none other available). I transplanted them carefully to a more spacious tray and then after 10 days put them into a good composted veg. bed, they are thriving. They got rock dust and rock phosphate too. **Chives** are doing well and the green tops get cut regularly and the plants get a regular dressing of dried chicken manure or mature goat manure.

The Greenhouse shop in Kuranda sells organic grown seeds and sometimes good seedlings and organic Macadamia nuts in the shell, also Liquid seaweed is available.

My old fashioned mauve **Gloxinias** (1 metre high) have been and still are flowering well. I can divide them after flowering if anyone wants a plant. **Poinsettias** are now a blaze of colour, worth growing with no pests (like the Gloxinias). After flowering best to cut them down and plant woody cuttings. The **Rare Fruits** are not having an evening meeting this June. Members only, are having a field day on June 12th. Anyone interested in joining Raw Fruits can phone me on 937205.

KURANDA LANDCARE-ONE YEAR OLD AND 3000 TREES NOW PLANTED!!

Congratulations Kuranda!! Landcare has had a very successful year. The plantations we have established are growing well and improving the appearance of the approaches to Kuranda, as well as limiting erosion and weed growth. The 130- strong membership of Kuranda Landcare have shown that, as a community we can be quite effective in improving our environment, the team approach avoiding great loads on any one individual, and building a greater community cohesion. There is also a benefit in relating to government departments and we have found that they are very helpful, when they see constructively motivated groups. We have found that they often have funds and assistance available, but require a community approach to be made to them. This is reasonable, as they are often attacked by individuals with opposing viewpoints, and are consequently reluctant to act. During the last year we have had great assistance from the Wet Tropics Tree Planting Scheme, who have supplied trees, and helped with weed control, hole digging and irrigation. Also, Mareeba Shire Engineering Department have assisted with advice and the installation of irrigation systems. The MRD has assisted with earthworks as have our local private backhoe operators, Gus and Garth Creswell and Malcolm Frost-- all done free of charge to Kuranda Landcare! As can be seen, there has been quite a list of benefactors.

So, what have we done this last year?

- + We have planted 3000 trees around Kuranda.
- + We applied for, and received a grant from the DPI to continue our revegetation program in the '94-'95 financial year.
- + We put in a submission to the Barron River Catchment Study, and attended seminars.
- + We attended the Townsville DPI Conference on Toxic Algal Blooms.
- + We have formulated a draft policy on Landcare issues in Kuranda, and will work further with this in the broader community, through the DCP Working Group, to produce a draft for a competent, binding and relevant Development Control Plan for Kuranda.
- + We have put in detailed submissions on water quality issues to Mareeba Shire Council, and Federal and State Ministers of Environment, and some of our members met with the Minister of Health to discuss these issues.

During the year, our President, Howard Stevens, was embroiled in a conflict with Mareeba Shire Council regarding septic sewerage effluent and its possible pollution of the forest streams in the Top of the Range Estate. This led to DEH testing of coliform bacteria counts which showed faecal pollution but did not determine its source. Dr. Lesley Clark then chaired a meeting of Health professionals in Cairns, which concluded that this pollution could be coming from septic installations and that a Working Group should be set up to advise on future more stringent controls on on-site sewerage disposal. Unfortunately, our previous Council did not agree to this but times have changed, and the MSC engineering department is now looking at formulating new by-laws on sewerage in this area, and have already prepared a draft of these new by-laws. These will be available for public scrutiny, and submissions shortly. Water quality is a top priority, nation-wide and we will continue to monitor this situation closely.

We are a practical group, and we try to act in a direct way. We are interested in helping formulate policies but as an organisation have not involved ourselves in political action, or contentious issues. This is one of the reasons for the success of the Australian Landcare movement -- it keeps itself involved in practical, non contentious solutions. Of course, many of our members are active, privately, in pursuing the more contentious issues.

Our committee has kept our public meetings to a minimum, only calling meetings when we have important decisions to make-- but that time is now at hand!

We will have our next public meeting at Frog's Restaurant, on Monday 6th June at 7.30pm.

Issues on the agenda are the presenting of the draft policy, new projects to consider in the next financial year and the election of a new committee. So, if any Kuranda residents would like to be involved or have any projects that may be of a Landcare nature, please come along and let us know. Many Kuranda residents have said they would like to be involved in the future - now is the time to act! We are only limited by the preparation time in doing more plantings, so we need more people involved in brushcutting and hole-digging. If you own a brushcutter or shovel or post-hole digger, or would like to operate one please let us know.

THE GARDEN AS ART

The Renaissance Part One: The Italian Dream

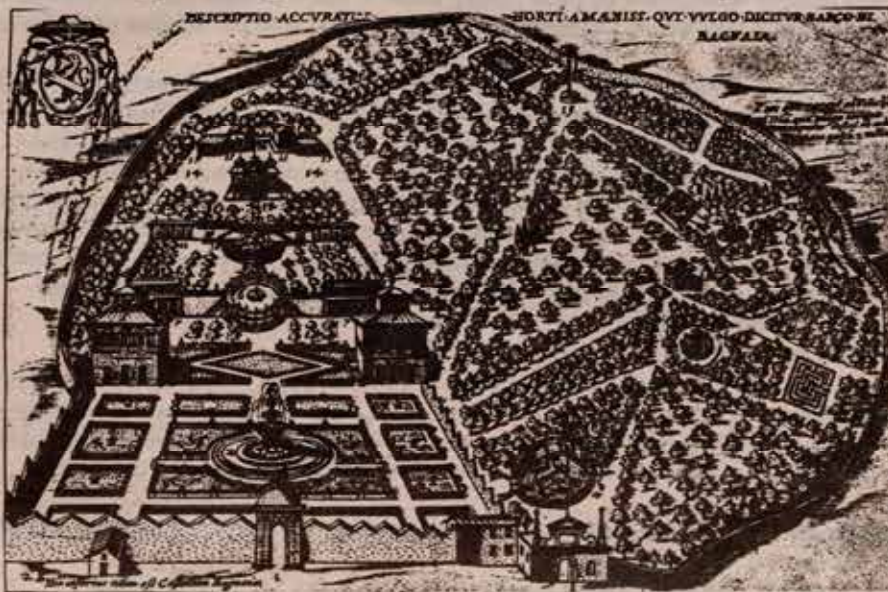
Western Europe emerged from the Dark Ages with a longing for the perceived order and stability of 'the good old days'. Increasing prosperity led a grand vision of man as a being confident in his ability to impose order (civilization) on the external (wild) world.

By the mid - 15th century this dream was evident in the Italian Renaissance garden, starting near Florence where the old medieval enclosures were opened up, with each rectangular cloister being sited one behind each other - extending the main axis - creating a determined link between the prosperity of house and extending it out into the natural world - creating a small kingdom. Villas were sited for amenity not defence and so the gardens became increasingly more open with views and later physical extensions. The gardens combined the function of open air room and sculpture garden, often borrowing elements of the classical world including fountains, statuary and grottos.

The unity of house and garden as well as the need for technical solutions to the problems created by the steep slopes favored in the Italian villas threw the planning of these gardens into the hands of architects and elements of 'built' landscape were a major feature - especially the use of stone walls, terraces and stairways. Most influential was the design by Donato Bramante for the Vatican, linking the Papal palace with the Villa Belvedere.

Flowers were used extensively in Italian gardens but because of the short growing season more emphasis was placed on evergreens - trimmed hedges of herbs such as lavender and rosemary, and box hedges. Cypress, ilex and laurel trees and ivy were valued for their foliage and aesthetic contrast with stonework.

There was quite a lot of variation within the style, dictated by date, site and regional variation. Most important though was the garden's function - from small domestic villa to huge public gardens designed for crowds, or the sumptuous gardens such as the parterre at Bagnaia, designed for the enjoyment of a select, discerning company.

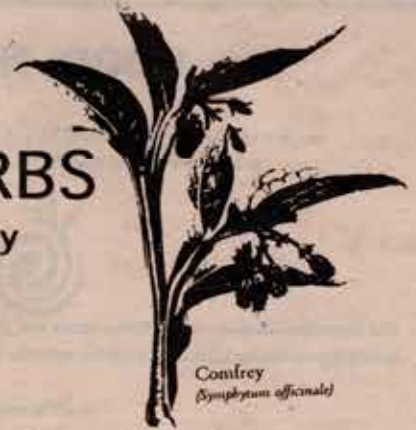
Probably the most remarkable garden was the mid-century wonder of the Villa d at Tivoli in the Sabine Hills, built around a river which plunges down a steep slope which is harnessed to an astonishing number of fountains (including a 'water organ) and is then flaunted outrageously throughout the garden - a spectacular permanent theatrical performance intended to astonish and impress the multitudes.

As the 16th century closed and the 17th century began, increasing invasions by the French were taking their toll on the second golden age of Italy. The glory of French design would dominate western landscape for the next two hundred years.

TALKING HERBS

This Month: Comfrey

Others names: knitbone, knitback, bruisewort, boneset, gum plant.

Because of the detrimental effects recorded on the SMALL experimental rodents who were fed LARGE amounts of comfrey it has been banned as an internal medicine in some Australian states. Someone will soon tell me if Queensland is one of 'em! Herbal practitioners who have seen the research literature, protested that the findings were inconclusive and the test methods faulty so although the ban continues, so does the research. Meanwhile back in Kuranda, I follow the advice of the old herb doctors and use it frequently. In a large family there are many calls for treatment of strains, sprains, bruises, bumps and wounds. Comfrey is truly No.1. for any of these. It contains a chemical called allantoin which stimulates cell growth and tannins which are astringent and helpful for closing wounds.

For a cut, make sure it's clean (I use hydrogen peroxide) and the flesh edges meet. Mash fresh comfrey leaves with a tiny splash of hot water and put the mash inside a folded chux cloth. Place it on the wound and bandage. Change twice a day. For a bruise or sprain apply bruised comfrey leaves inside a chux and bandage. I support the external treatment with a few doses of comfrey tea which tastes revolting so add peppermint and sweeten with honey. The swelling will come down quickly. The bruise will come out and go away. Warning: wounds heal very fast so check with the doctor if you think it may need stitches or it could heal raggedly. Two days of comfrey bandaging would be too late for stitching. The mucilage in comfrey is good to use for coughs and bronchitis, soothing and reducing irritation while helping rid the body of mucus. If a cough was present in a flu I would add comfrey to last months flu tea remedy of ginger, alder flower yarrow and peppermint for a potent brew.

Comfrey grows well in this area and is excellent for your soil and compost bin. I have plenty of plants to give away if anyone wants any. ph 938700. To dry the leaves I thread them on string with a bodkin and hang under the verandah. Wash the roots with a soft brush eg. old tooth brushes and dry in the sun whole until they feel brittle. Grind dried root with a mortar and pestle as needed for an infusion.

Thanks to everyone who helped make this day such a great success.

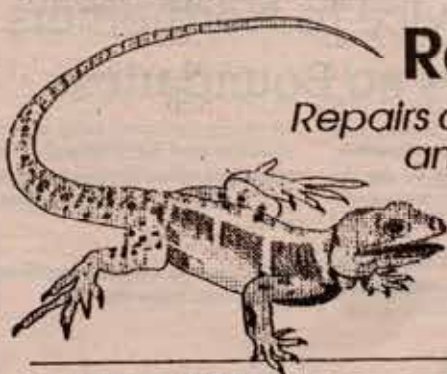

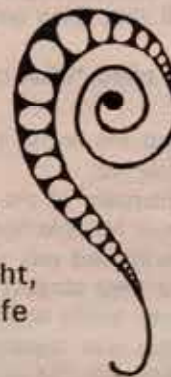

Skyrail: A Vision; Ecology & Things Like That

Skyrail has been approved and a time of healing and reconciliation has passed. Tourists are wafting their way above the forests in the gondolas on the air. Through all booking agencies it is the "must-do" trip. Enjoy and see our rainforest from the air. See it all, - a waterfall, a vast carpet of green tree tops, no sweat, no scrub itch, no snakes, no birds, no butterflies - but a vast carpet of green tree tops! Isn't it something?!

Selected, bare breasted Kiwis will be allowed to bungee jump over the falls, and photograph processors will process endless pictures of vast areas of green treetops and a waterfall.

A fortune will be made by "T-shirt" vendors - the shirt portraying a green frog on the front, "Save the Rainforests" on the back and "Made in Taiwan" on the label.

But one day strange things will come to pass and someone will drop a coke bottle.

Down on the forest floor, Kurrabarrapul - or big Frankie to his friends, is out communing with his ancestors at a sacred site. He hears this funny whistling noise and taking off his sunglasses, he looks up. The bottle lands right in the middle of his ancestors. "Bloody Hell" he says, "A coke bottle! How did that get here?" and then he saw the passing skyrail.

"I knew it" he cried. "I bloody knew it! I knew if that thing got going it would disturb my ancestors."

And so he apologised to his ancestors and asked "What can I do to protect you from this sort of thing?"

And they said "Sue the bastards." So he put the bottle in the glovebox of his new four wheel drive, went back to town and straight to his solicitor.

He had taken courses and had found his Aboriginality so he was determined to stand on protocol. "Listen women" he said. "You don't walk up 'longside me. You walk behind me woman."

Now Jean had a PHI in Literature, was a computer expert, did aerobics and worked out twice a week and had a black belt. She'd had a cow of a day and this pissed her right off.

So she stepped back behind Kurrabarrapul, picked up the coke bottle and hit him fair between the ears with it.

He collapsed moaning "I love you woman." Young Franke yelled "Good one Mum", and the baby started to cry.

Just then their neighbour landed back. She'd been thinking things over and had also been to TAFE where she'd taken courses in Caring & Sharing Positive Energy Direction and Conflict Resolution. She also knew Jean had a black belt, so she said "Listen Luv, why doesn't big Frankie look after the kids for a while and you and I will go up the pub and sort out our problems over a beer?"

Jean said "Righto", so they left Kurrabarrapul holding his head in one hand and the baby in the other and young Frankie hoying stones at the coke bottle, and the went up the pub.

After some Kahluas and milk, cold lagers and a couple of rums, they hugged and kissed and made up.

It was agreed that big Franke would fix the window because, as the neighbour said "All those diesel fumes from tourist buses get in the house and the kids are always coughing" and she had sinuses and a chest herself.

SKYRAIL MEDIA RELEASE

released May 18th

After 7 long years of studies, reports, public consultation and examination by 22 different government departments, the skyrail Rainforest Cableway has now been given the final tick with the approval of the project's System Specification. This System Specification now becomes a part of the Development agreement, which is secured by a \$1 million cash bond lodged by Skyrail to guarantee compliance with its condition.

The Managing director of Skyrail Pty Ltd, Dr Ken Chapman said today " that the approved System Specification together with the Environmental Management Plan provides the irrefutable proof that Skyrail Rainforest Cableway will be built in the most environmentally sensitive fashion possible.

"The document demonstrates Skyrail's commitment to the environment and once again shows up the dishonesty and misinformation of the anti-Skyrail propaganda". "This small group of radicals continually base their argument against the project on innuendo and outright lies. Now that we have the System Specification approval we can refute these ambiguous and false claims" he said.

"The facts of the project are there in black and white:

- There will be no new roads built for the construction or operation of the cableway. Helicopters will be used for all transportation of plant and equipment.
- Personnel will have pedestrian access only and this will be limited to selected approved routes.
- There will be no swathe clearing along the route of the cableway.
- Towers will be constructed on sites which are only 10 metres by 10 metres.
- All stations will be constructed. They can not be seen from the other side of the Barron Gorge.
- The entire area of clearing over the whole route of the cableway is less than half a hectare. Compare this to extra lanes on the Kuranda Range road or car parks in Daintree for example.
- The Skyrail Rainforest Cableway will offer a totally different tourist experience to the Kuranda scenic railway allowing large numbers of tourists to experience the wonders of the Rainforest at close hand yet leave no footprint. The Cableway and the Scenic railway are seen as complimentary not competitive and will be marketed as a combined package.
- In addition to the Rainforest experience that skyrail will provide, it will allow Kuranda to be the Village In The rainforest once again and not be the Carpark in the rainforest.
- The Skyrail Rainforest Cableway is environmental tourism and the environment is our Core asset, we will respect and protect that asset.
- Whilst the Cableway will be the longest of its type in the world, its construction is a simple engineering task using methods which are tested and proved worldwide. Skyrail is to the Rainforest what the fast catamarans and pontoons are to the Reef - high quality environmental tourism without impacts.

Report on meeting held on 17th May

Next meeting Kuranda Amphitheatre 31st May 7.30pm.

The meeting started with a barbeque and as a added bonus Mantaka was rehearsing in the background. A very relaxed and enjoyable lead up to an interesting meeting.

First up Lance Riley discussed Djabugay issues, he called for a closer working relationship with PAKS. A Djabugay general meeting will be held shortly, members of PAKS will attend this meeting to discuss how we can come together, it is also hoped a cultural awareness workshop can be set up. More details will be released in the next newsletter.

CAFNEC management committee have endorsed the direct action campaign as a last resort. We now have four local groups- Wilderness Society, PAKS, CAFNEC and Wildlife Action Group. Two members from each of these groups will form an alliance and act as an organised strategic council-Rainforest Defence Council. This councils first function will be to approach the Djabugay Council and ask permission to hold a direct action campaign on their land, and to receive relevant information concerning sacred sites ect.

A Non-Violence Direct Action Workshop will be held this week-end 21st - 22nd May. It is most important that all those who wish to participate in direct action have non-violence training. Please contact Steve on 937128. A lot of funds will be needed for direct action. If you dont feel you can help in the forest but would like to help financially, we would greatly appreciate it. Although many members of PAKS will not be active in direct action we will be supporting the Barron Gorge Wildlife Action Group, who are running the direct action side of things. All donations must clearly be marked as "Direct Action Donation." Donations can be sent to the above address. We expect direct action to begin in around six weeks.

PAKS are conducting two walks of the cableway route. A walk to Red Peak on Saturday, May 28th (contact Peter Bastion, 557619) and a walk from Deans Lookout to Red Peak on Saturday 4th June (contact Bronwyn Rohweder) are available.

New Federal Environment Minister John Faulkner made a statement in Parliament last week indicating that he was not going to stop the Sky-Rail project. PAKS had a meeting with him later in the week and he told us he can only stop the project if World Heritage Values were affected. While he accepts that the area will be damaged and that there will be a loss of "ordinary" heritage values, the World Heritage Values should be alright.

Sean Purcell from CAFNEC has received a stack of documents through Freedom of Information. CAFNEC and PAKS are scanning them at present. CAFNEC is convening a lawyers group who have expressed strong interest in taking the Commonwealth Government to court for allowing Sky-Rail to proceed, and for not protecting the Wet Tropics World Heritage Area.

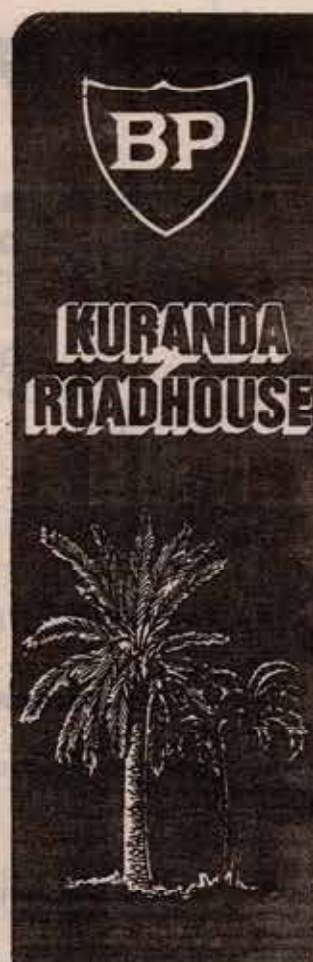

THE LOAN

Wayne Foster sat in his bedroom wallowing in self pity. The pain he suffered was like a red hot corkscrew twisting in his chest and had not been relieved by the half bottle of whisky he had drunk.

God! it hurt being jilted. My fiancée and my best mate eloping together, hope they both finish up in hell. All the wedding arrangements to be cancelled. Christ! what a mess.

That night his mother suggested, to get over his humiliation, he visit her brother Harvey's cattle station for a time.

Telephoning his uncle, he was told he was welcome, and after booking a seat, he was to leave the next day on the motor-coach that serviced the small town nearest his destination.

On arriving, he was met by his uncle at the bus stop in the foothills of the surrounding Snowy Mountains. Harvey Matson, a robust looking man about sixty-five years of age, was obviously pleased to see his nephew again.

At the homestead, they were met by the housekeeper, the wife of the head stockman. They also lived in the house with Uncle Harvey.

The house was on the eastern side of the range. Another homestead, housing the rest of the station staff, was situated about six kilometres on the western side. After dinner, the stockman and his wife said their goodnights. On their departure, Wayne and his uncle retired to the adjoining lounge room. The two men were silent for a while.

"Like to tell me about it, Wayne? I know something is troubling you. You can trust me, I am, and always have been, your friend."

All the emotion that had been stifled since Wayne had left home erupted, words spilled out like a torrent.

Uncle Harvey put his hand on Wayne's arm consolingly.

"Haven't you ever wondered why I never married? I, too, was jilted. At the time I was thirty six and I had made a lot of money on the Stock Exchange. Like you, I decided to get away from it all. This property had been listed for sale as two separate leases and I knew that legislation was soon to be passed that would enable me to freehold the leases cheaply. I bought the leases from the woman who owned them. I, later, found this woman was the epitome of understatement of a saying my dear old dad used to quote: "Some women are funny cattle". Shall I tell you about her?" "Yes, please do."

Many years ago, the individual leases were owned by two separate families. Wayne made a move and raised his eyebrows again. His uncle continued...

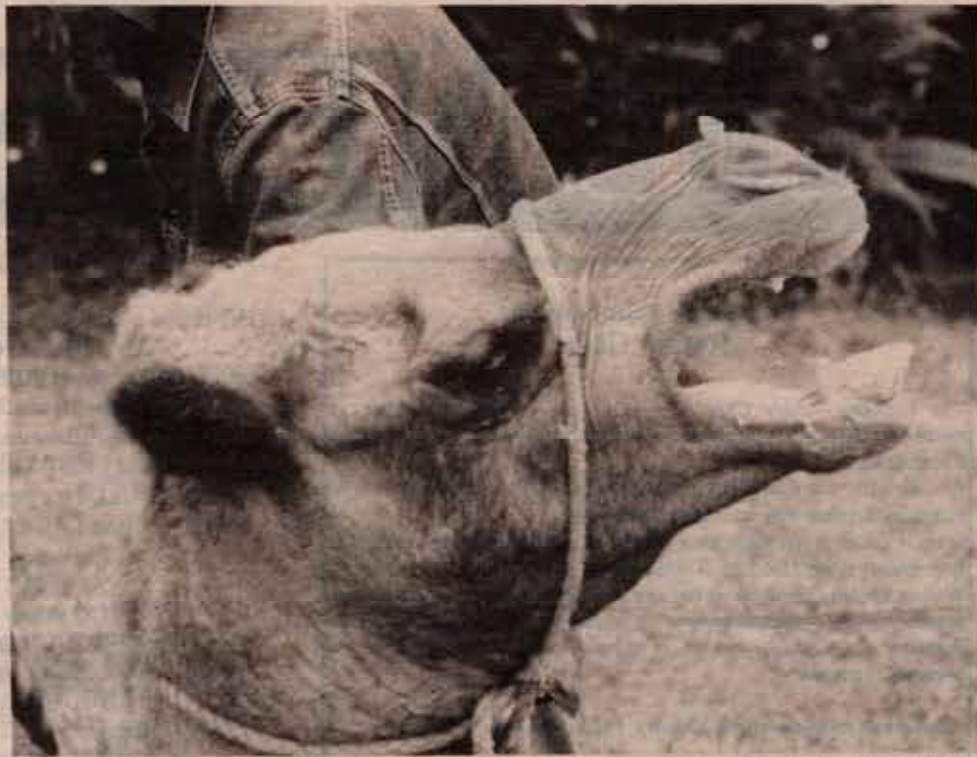

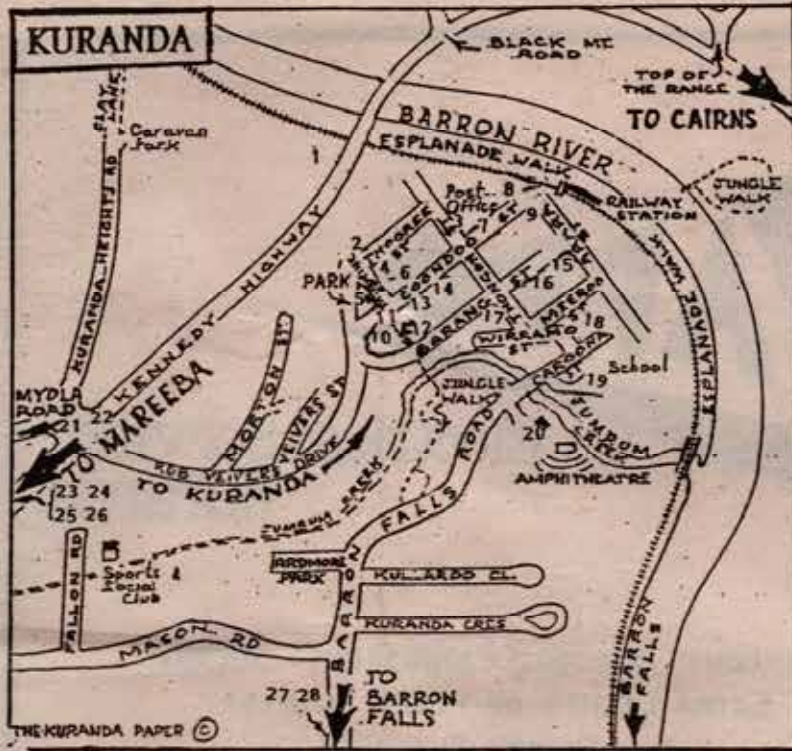
